1. The salmonid fish from which the product in the consignment was derived has been sourced from Norway only
2. The salmonid fish from which the product was derived do not come from a farm infected by, or officially suspected of being infected by, infectious salmon anemia (ISA), or from waters within 10 km or on tidal interchange (whichever is greater) of an infected, or officially suspected farm
3. The salmonid fish from which the product was derived were:
  - a. harvested from populations for which documented health surveillance programmes exist which are administered by the Norwegian Food Safety Authority,
  - b. not slaughtered as an official disease control measure,
  - c. inspected and graded, ensuring the products for export are free from visible lesions associated with infectious disease and fit for human consumption
  - d. found to be not sexually mature adults/spawners (fish with developed gonads/roe)
  - e. found not to be juvenile salmonid fish (weighing less than 200g in head-off, de-gilled and eviscerated state)
  - f. thoroughly washed on external and internal surfaces to remove any extraneous material
  - g. processed to the extent listed under "I. Details identifying the fishery products", under "state or type of processing"
